By this petition, quashing of FIR No. 366 dated 28.05.2016, is sought, registered against the petitioners at Police Station Sirsa City, District Sirsa, for the alleged commission of offences punishable under Sections 420/406/120-B/34 IPC, on the basis of a compromise arrived at between the petitioners (accused) and respondent no. 2, i.e. the complainant.

Vide an order of this Court dated 21.12.2017, the parties were directed to appear before the learned trial Court/Illaq Magistrate to get their statements recorded, in terms of the compromise.

As already recorded in the last order of this Court dated 23.01.2018, the report of the learned Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Sirsa, has been sent to this Court, in which it is stated that the parties to the dispute, i.e. the accused-petitioners and respondent no. 2, i.e. the complainant Chander Parkash, have both

suffered statements to the effect that the matter has been compromised without any fear or pressure on either of them.

Photocopies of the statements of the petitioners and the complainant Chander Parkash (in Hindi), have been annexed with the petition. In the statement of respondent no. 2, he has stated that the matter has been resolved between the accused and him, with no kind of dispute left pending and he has no objection to any order passed by the Court in favour of the petitioners.

Learned counsel for the State, on instructions from ASI Bhupender Singh, also submits that no other criminal case has ever been registered against the petitioners.

In view of the above, in the opinion of this Court, it would be pointless to continue with criminal proceedings, the parties having fully compromised the matter of their own free will, looking also at the nature of the offences alleged.

Consequently, the petition is allowed and FIR No. 366 dated 28.05.2016, registered against the petitioners at Police Station Sirsa City, District Sirsa, for the alleged commission of offences punishable under Sections 420/406/120-B/34 IPC, along with all proceedings emanating therefrom, is hereby quashed.
