This is a second petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C for grant of bail in FIR No. 214 dated 04.07.2015 registered under Sections 406, 420 and 120-B IPC and Section 3 of Haryana Protection of Interest of Depositors Act, 2014 at Police Station DLF Phase-I, District Gurugram.

Against the order dated 18.09.2018 passed by this Court, the petitioner had approached Hon'ble the Supreme Court by way of SLP (Criminal) No. 8620-22 of 2018 wherein the following order has been passed on 23.10.2018:-

*“We have heard learned counsel for the parties.
We are not inclined to interfere with the impugned order(s) in exercise of our jurisdiction under Article 136 of the Constitution of India.
The special leave petitions are accordingly dismissed.
However, two weeks' time is granted to the petitioner to surrender and move application for regular bail before the concerned trial Court. Such prayer as and when made shall be considered and decided by the trial Court expeditiously.
Pending applications, if any, shall also stand disposed of.”*

Further, on 26.10.2018, the following order was passed by Hon'ble the Supreme Court :-

*“Taken on Board.
Order dated 23rd October, 2018 passed by this Court, shall stand modified to the extent that instead of the expressing “two weeks' time” the same shall be read as “three weeks' time.”*

Admittedly, the petitioner has not surrendered before the learned trial Court. Let the petitioner approach the learned trial Court in pursuance of the aforesaid orders. No case for bail or entertaining the present petition is made out.

Dismissed.
