SUDIP AHLUWALIA, J. (ORAL)

In this petition, the petitioners, who are the accused persons in F.I.R. No.76, dated 20.09.2014, under Sections 452, 323, 341, 506, 148 and 149 of the Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Sadar Rajpura, District Patiala (Annexure P-1), have prayed for quashing of F.I.R. with all subsequent proceedings on the basis of compromise.

[2]. With the intervention of respectables and elderly people of the society, respondent No.2 has arrived at a settlement with the accused vide Mutual Compromise (Annexure P-2) which is duly signed by her. The

matter was referred to the Court below for recording of statements of the parties and to report with respect to genuineness of the compromise arrived at between the parties. The Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Rajpura, vide report dated 15.02.2018, has apprised this Court that the compromise arrived at between the parties is genuine and without any pressure.

[3]. Respondents No. 2 to 4 are represented by their Counsel, who does not oppose the compromise.

[4]. In terms of the report of the Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Rajpura, and in view of the decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in "Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another", 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and "Narinder Singh and Others Vs. State of Punjab and Another", (2014) 6 SCC 466, this Court is of the opinion that no useful purpose can be served by keeping with the criminal proceedings pending, since the complainant has herself compromised the dispute with the petitioners/accused persons.

[5]. In the circumstances, the present petition is allowed. F.I.R. No.76, dated 20.09.2014, under Sections 452, 323, 341, 506, 148 and 149 of the Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Sadar Rajpura, District Patiala (Annexure P-1), and all consequential proceedings arising therefrom are hereby quashed on the basis of compromise qua the present petitioners.
