Petitioners-Ravinder alias Monu and Paramjit alias Preet have filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.530 dated 16.05.2017, registered at Police Station Karnal City, District Karnal, under Sections 379 and 420 of IPC.

Notice of motion was issued. Learned State counsel appeared and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioners as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

From the record, I find that FIR, in the present case, has been registered on the application/complaint of complainant-Sukhdev

Singh wherein he stated that on 15.05.2017, at about 8.00 P.M., he had gone to ATM for the purpose of withdrawal of amount. His ATM Card was new and had to obtain a pin code for the same. When he could not get the pin code, two persons standing behind him offered help on which the said persons entered a pin code of their own and changed his ATM card. They also withdrew an amount of ₹56,000/- fraudulently in his account.

The petitioners had been in custody since 09.06.2017, but were released on interim bail by this Court vide order dated 06.03.2018. They are now not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as challan has already been presented. The trial of the case will take a long time. Therefore, no useful purpose will be served by sending the petitioners in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail subject to their furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹40,000/- with one surety in the like amount each to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
