Petitioners-Ramesh, Deepak @ Deepi and Sunil have filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.836 dated 20.08.2018, registered at Police Station Sadar Hisar, District Hisar, under Sections 147, 148, 307, 323, 341, 452 and 506 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 and Section 25 of the Arms Act, 1959 (later on offence under Sections 27, 30 and 54 of the Arms Act, 1959 were added and offence under Section 307 of IPC, 1860 has been deleted).

Notice of motion has been issued.

Learned State counsel appeared and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

From the record, I find that the offence under Section 307 of

IPC has already been deleted. No injury has been declared dangerous to life in this case. The allegation against present petitioner Deepak @ Deepi is that he only caught hold complainant-Mahender. Petitioners-Ramesh and Sunil are stated to have given simple injuries with danda to the complainant.

Petitioners Ramesh and Sunil have been in custody since 23.08.2018, whereas petitioner Deepak @ Deepi has been in custody since 21.08.2018. They are not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as they are in judicial custody. The trial of the case may take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping them in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail subject to their furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹40,000/- with one surety in the like amount each to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
