Prayer in this application filed under Section 482 Cr.PC is for placing on record the bank details as Annexure P-6 showing the residence proof of petitioner No.2 Mittal Pal @ Vicky.

The document Annexure P-6 is taken on record subject to all just exceptions.

The petitioners have filed present petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is issuance of directions to the respondents No.1, 2 and 6 to protect the life and liberty of the petitioners at the hands of private respondents No.3 to 5.

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that the petitioners are major and have solemnized their marriage in accordance with law.

However, respondents No.3 to 5 are not accepting their marriage and are

adamant to separate them from each other by resorting to illegal means. Learned counsel further submits that in view of imminent danger to the life and liberty of the petitioners, petitioner No.1 had moved a representation dated 01.10.2018 (Annexure P-5) to respondent No.2- Senior Superintendent of Police, District SAS Nagar, Mohali.

He further states that the petitioners do not seek any relief qua respondent No.6 i.e. SHO, Police Station Soron, District Kasganj (U.P.) as the petitioners are residing within the territorial jurisdiction of this Court.

Notice of motion to respondents No.1 and 2 only at this stage.

On asking of the Court, Mr. Surinder Pal Singh Tinna, Additional Advocate General, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of these respondents.

Let requisite number of copies of paper book be given to learned State counsel during the course of the day.

In view of the above, without going into the validity of the marriage, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to the respondent No.2 to take appropriate remedial measures, as warranted by law, on the representation dated 01.10.2018 (Annexure P-5) submitted by petitioner No.1.

In the meantime, necessary order be passed to ensure that no harm is caused to the life and liberty of the petitioners at the hands of respondents No.3 to 5.
