Petitioner Mandeep has filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.112 dated 26.09.2018, registered at Police Station Bapoli, District Panipat, under Sections 379, 420, 467, 468 and 471 of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion was issued.

Learned State counsel appeared and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

From the record, I find that as per the FIR, present petitioner-Mandeep had taken away the car of complainant Surender Kumar with the intention of theft.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the present

petitioner had purchased the car from the complainant and the amount had been transferred to his account.

The petitioner has been in custody since 14.10.2018. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The trial of the case may take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
