On the last date of hearing, the complainant's side had stated
that they had paid Rs.4 lakhs for purchase of car.

The petitioner's side had asserted that the amount was paid by
them. They have referred to the cheques that were paid for payment of the
initial amount and the subsequent amounts.

Counsel for the petitioner further refers to the judgment passed
in the petition filed under Section 13-B of the Hindu Marriage Act. Counsel

urges that the Court has observed that the wife had an underdeveloped brain as of a child and had suicidal tendency and it would not be safe for him to reside with the respondent & the facts have been concealed at the time of marriage and the marriage was dissolved.

In view of the fact that the petitioner has joined the investigation and the complainant's side unable to show that they have paid any amount for the purchase of the car, the petition is allowed and order dated 06.03.2018 granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute subject to the conditions laid down in Section 438 Sub Section 2 Clauses (i) (ii) and (iii) of the Code of Criminal Procedure.
