Though learned counsel for the petitioner reiterates what he had stated on the last date of hearing, to the effect that he returned Rs.1 lakh to the complainant, Avtar Singh, learned counsel appearing for the complainant seeks time to verify the aforesaid fact, because one of the cheques stated to be have been issued by the petitioner was dishonored (as contended by the learned counsel for the complainant).

However, that apart, learned State counsel having submitted that there are now 7 other FIRs registered against the petitioner, with the allegation of similar offences having been committed, I see no reason to entertain this petition, which is consequently dismissed.

However, all observations made by this Court heretofore or in the previous order, would be only in the context of granting/refusing anticipatory bail to the petitioner, with the investigating agency and the competent authority to look into the allegations against the petitioner wholly as per the evidence obtained and led.
