The petitioner has filed present petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for issuance of a directions to respondents No.1 and 2 to transfer the investigation in FIR No.43 dated 09.02.2018 under Sections 420, 447, 511, 506 and 120-B IPC as well as Sections 25 and 27 of the Arms Act, 1959 registered at Police Station Sadar, Ludhiana to the Central Bureau of Investigation or to the State Crime Branch or to conduct further investigation/ *de novo* investigation from SIT headed by the officer not below the rank of Superintendent of Police.

Prayer has also been made for issuance of a direction to the official respondents that the private respondents may not cause any harm to the petitioner and his family members and further the life and liberty of the petitioner be saved and protected.

The aforesaid FIR was registered against the petitioner and other co-accused at the behest of complainant Pammi widow of Sukhjit Singh. The police has conducted investigation and submitted the Challan in the Court against the petitioner and other co-accused, namely, Tripan Passi and Manohar Lal Passi. Later on, the supplementary Challan was presented in the Court against accused Gurpreet Singh, Vinay Passi and Yashpal. Later on, an application had been moved by the prosecution for re-investigation of the case, which was dismissed by learned Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Ludhiana vide order dated 28.08.2018.

Having heard learned counsel for the petitioner and perusing the order dated 28.08.2018 passed by learned Magistrate, this Court finds that investigation in the case is already over. Moreover, no such material has been brought to the notice of this Court which may give a cause for issuance of such like direction. Therefore, this Court does not find any merit in the present petition and the same is, accordingly, dismissed.
