This order shall dispose of CRM-M-52110-2018, filed by petitioner-Jaswant Singh, CRM-M-52127-2018, filed by petitioner-Manjit Kaur and CRM-M-52136-2018, filed by petitioner-Paramvir Singh, under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 (for brevity, 'Cr.P.C.') for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.132 dated 30.10.2018, registered at Police Station Shubhanpur, Kapurthala, under Sections 447, 379, 436, 511, 34, 506, 120-B and 341 of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion was issued in all these petitions. Learned State counsel put in appearance on behalf of the respondent-State and complainant also appeared through his counsel. They contested these petitions.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

From the record, I find that FIR, in the present case, has been registered against 14 persons. The petitioners are named in the FIR. As per the allegations, there is a dispute regarding the land. As per the allegations, Tara Singh had brought the burning wheat straw in the fields. There is nothing that he had attempted to put the crop on fire.

In pursuance of the interim orders dated 28.11.2018 passed in all these petitions by this Court, the petitioners have already joined the investigation. They are not required for custodial interrogation. Therefore, no useful purpose will be served by sending them to custody.

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Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts of the case in minute details and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, I find merit in all these petitions and the same are allowed. The orders dated 28.11.2018, granting interim bail to the petitioners, are made absolute. However, the petitioners shall join the investigation as and when called upon to do so and shall abide by the conditions of Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C.
