Prayer in this petition filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C. is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners in case FIR No.261 dated 11.08.2018 registered under Sections 323, 341, 147, 148, 149 of IPC and Sections 25, 24 of Arms Act, 1959 at Police Station Sector 26, Chandigarh.

Learned counsel for the petitioners states that pursuant to the orders dated 30.11.2018 and 13.12.2018 passed by this Court, petitioners have joined the investigation.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of UT Chandigarh, on instructions from HC Balvir Chand, does not dispute the aforesaid fact and states that the custodial interrogation of the petitioners is no more required at this stage.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties.

Since the petitioners have joined the investigation and their custodial interrogation is no more required, present petition is allowed and the interim bail granted to the petitioners vide order dated 30.11.2018 is made absolute.

However, if required, the petitioners shall continue to join investigation as and when required to do so and shall abide by the terms and conditions, as laid down under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.
