Petitioner seeks regular under Section 439 Cr.P.C. in FIR No.185 dated 3.7.2016, registered under Section 306 IPC at Police Station City Khanna.

Heard.

Allegations against the petitioner are that the complainant Avtar Singh was a divorcee and thereafter, he re-married with the present petitioner who was having adulterous relations with one auto driver, namely, Subhash. On the day of crime i.e. 27.6.2016, petitioner after making some excuse went to meet Subhash and was caught by the petitioner. Subhash demanded Rs.8000/- from the petitioner as a price to take back his wife and insulted him. Avtar Singh thereafter went to his house and committed suicide after putting kerosene on him. Petitioner was arrested on 11.11.2017 and is in custody since then. In this case, challan

was presented on 12.1.2018 and during these 11 months, out of 13 witnesses, only 2 witnesses have been examined.

Considering the slow pace of trial and the fact that disposal of challan will take time, further detention of the petitioner is considered unnecessary. Accordingly, the petition is allowed. Petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of Rs.1,00,000/- with one surety of the like amount to the satisfaction of learned trial Court subject to the following conditions:-

- (i)The petitioner shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer,
- (ii)The petitioner will surrender his passport before the trial Court, if any and shall not leave India without the prior permission of the Court,
- (iii)He will appear before trial Court on each and every date of hearing, in case of his absence, trial Court shall be competent to cancel his bail.
