CRM-M-5477 of 2018

Petitioner seeks anticipatory bail in FIR No.136 dated 31.08.2017, registered under Sections 420, 406, 506, 120-B of Indian Penal Code, 1860 (for short 'IPC'), at Police Station Barara, District Ambala, Haryana. This Court had made an order dated 19.02.2018 granting *ad interim* anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

Heard learned counsel for the rival parties including the counsel for the complainant.

Learned counsel for the complainant vehemently submitted that the complainant has suffered business losses, which are liable to be made good by the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the order dated 19.02.2018 has been complied with which is not disputed by the other side. He submitted that in addition, petitioner has also deposited ₹10,000/-.

Statements are accepted.

In view of the compliance made, order dated 19.02.2018 granting *ad interim* anticipatory bail to the petitioner, is made absolute. It is made clear that the parties are at liberty to take such steps as available in law in respect of any other grievances including the grievance of the complainant for claiming damages for the business losses. Police may file final report in accordance with law.

Petition stands disposed of.
