TEJINDER SINGH DHINDSA, J.(ORAL)

This order shall dispose of the instant petition filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C. seeking concession of pre arrest bail to the petitioners in case FIR No.61 dated 18.07.2017, under Sections 452/324/341/34 IPC, registered at Police Station Badhni Kalan, District Moga.

While issuing notice of motion, the following order was passed by this Court on 11.01.2018:-

“Petitioners seek the concession of pre-arrest bail in case FIR No.61 dated 18.7.2017 under Sections 452, 324, 341, 34 I.P.C. Registered at Police Station, Badhni Kalan, District Moga.

Counsel contends that the parties are otherwise neighbors in a locality and the injuries as per allegations are simple in nature. In so far as offence under Section 452 I.P.C. is concerned, the allegations are stated to be utterly vague. Counsel

submits that the petitioners are otherwise ready and willing to join investigation and as such, custodial interrogation would not be warranted.

Notice of motion, returnable for 19.2.2018.

In the meanwhile, petitioners are directed to join investigation.

In the event of arrest, the petitioners shall be released on interim bail subject to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer/Investigating Officer. The petitioners shall join investigation as and when called upon to do so and they shall remain bound by the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.”

Learned State counsel upon instructions from HC Gurcharan Singh apprises the Court that the petitioners have since joined investigation.

That apart the observations made in the notice of motion order have gone uncontroverted.

In view of the above, prayer made in the petition is accepted.

Order dated 11.01.2018 passed by this Court is made absolute.
