MAHABIR SINGH SINDHU, J. (ORAL)

Present petition is filed praying for quashing FIR No.230 dated 14.12.2011, under Sections 420 and 406 of IPC and Section 24 of the Emigration Act, registered at Police Station Kapurthala City on the basis of compromise entered into between the parties.

2. Heard learned counsel for the parties and perused the paper book.

3. Both the parties were directed by this Court vide order dated 12.02.2018 to appear before the learned Area Magistrate/Trial Court and get their statements recorded and in pursuance thereof, learned Chief

Judicial Magistrate, Kapurthala recorded the statements of both the parties and has submitted a report dated 01.03.2018. A perusal of the report reveals that the compromise entered into between the parties is genuine and without any pressure, coercion, undue influence or inducement from any quarter. Even, as on today the parties are not disputing the factum of compromise arrived at between them.

4. No objection has been raised by the learned State counsel on a specific query put to him by the Court with regard to quashing of the FIR as well as all other consequential proceedings on the basis of the compromise effected between the parties in this case.

5. In view of the above, this Court is fully convinced that the offences are entirely personal in nature and do not affect any public peace or tranquility and thus quashing of FIR No.230 dated 14.12.2011 alongwith all consequential proceedings on the basis of compromise would bring peace and harmony to secure the ends of justice.

6. Accordingly, the impugned FIR and all consequential proceedings resulting therefrom, qua petitioner, are hereby quashed.

7. Petition is allowed.
