RAJ SHEKHAR ATTRI, J.(ORAL)

The present petition has been filed under Section 439 Code of Criminal Procedure for grant of regular bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.91 dated 20.10.2017 registered for the offences punishable under Sections 452, 323, 341, 506, 148, 149 of Indian Penal Code (for short, "IPC") and Section 307 IPC added later on, at Police Station Bakshiwala, District Patiala.

Heard.

It has been submitted that the matter has been compromised and matter i.e. *CRM-M-7935-2018* is pending for quashing of the present FIR. Petitioner is in custody since 11.12.2017.

Learned counsel for the complainant/respondent No.2 submitted that the matter has been compromised and he has no objection if the petitioner is granted regular bail. However, learned State counsel contest the petition on the ground that serious injuries have been attributed to the petitioner.

Without expressing any opinion on merits of the case and keeping in view the fact that conclusion of trial will take considerably long time and especially the fact that matter has been compromised, the present petition is allowed. Petitioner Simranjit Singh son of Gurminder Singh is ordered to be released on regular bail on furnishing bail bond and surety bond to the satisfaction of trial Court/Chief Judicial Magistrate/Duty Magistrate, concerned subject to following terms:-

- (a) The petitioner shall comply with the conditions mentioned in Section 437(3) Cr.P.C.
- (b) In the event of his absence on any date of hearing, the benefit of bail allowed to the petitioner shall stand withdrawn. The trial Court shall be competent to cancel his bail bond and surety bond and proceed to procure his presence in accordance with law. In that eventuality the petitioner shall have to apply for bail afresh.
- (c) He shall not leave the country without the previous permission of the Court.
