The petitioner prays for grant of anticipatory bail in FIR
No. 01 dated 05.01.2018, registered under Sections 420, 467, 468, 471 and
120-B of the IPC at Police Station SSOC Phase-1, S. A. S. Nagar (Mohali).

The operative part of the order dated 06.03.2018, vide which
the petitioner has been granted interim bail, is reproduced below:

“Learned Senior Counsel for the petitioner has submitted that as per the allegations in the FIR, the petitioner along with his brother – Sarabjit Singh opened an office of Council of Paramedical, Punjab and are providing fake degrees/certificates in the name of various open universities. It is further submitted that as per the Memorandum of Association of the society “Council of Paramedical, Punjab”, the brother of the petitioner namely Sarabjit Singh is the Chariman, one Ranjit is the Vice-Chairman and one Reasat Ali is the General Secretary and the petitioner is not an office bearer of the said society. Learned Senior Counsel for the petitioner has further submitted that in the alleged fake degrees/certificates, the petitioner is not the signatory. Counsel for the State, on instructions from ASI Kewal Singh, has submitted that there are allegations that the petitioner was preparing the fake degrees/certificates, however, it is not disputed

that he has not signed those degrees under his own signatures. It is further submitted that brother of the petitioner/co-accused – Sarabjit Singh has already surrendered before the trial Court and the petitioner be directed to join the investigation. List again on 25.04.2018.”

Learned senior counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner, in pursuance to the order dated 06.03.2018, has already appeared before the SHO/Investigating Officer and has joined the investigation.

Learned counsel for the State, on instructions from SI Komal Singh, submits that though the petitioner has joined investigation, however, he may be required for further investigation in order to complete the investigation.

In view of the above, the petition is allowed and the interim bail granted to the petitioner, vide order dated 06.03.2018, is made absolute subject to the condition that petitioner will rejoin the investigation as and when he is called upon to do so on receiving a written notice from the Investigating Officer. The petitioner shall also abide by the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.
