for registration of FIR on the complaint dated 04.12.2017 (Annexure P-2)
filed by the petitioner against private respondent Nos. 6 to 11, on which till
date no action has been taken by respondent No.3 on the same.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that he would be
satisfied if respondent No.3 be directed to look into the complaint dated
04.12.2017 (Annexure P-2) and take action in accordance with law, in a
time bound manner.

Notice of motion.

On asking of the Court, Mrs. Anju Arora, Addl. A.G., Punjab, who is present in the Court, accepts notice on behalf of respondents No. 1 to 5. Three copies of the petition be handed over to her by learned counsel for the petitioner during the course of the day failing which no action is called for. She submits that the complaint dated 04.12.2017 (Annexure P-2) will be decided within a period of six weeks.
