This order shall dispose of CRM-M-7495-2018, filed by petitioner-Arvel Singh @ Ravel Singh and CRM-M-10294-2018, filed by petitioner-Balwinder Singh alias Binder alias Mota under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case

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FIR No.62 dated 25.08.2017, registered at Police Station City-II, Mansa, under Sections 307, 436, 427, 148, 149, 120-B and 188 IPC, Sections 3 and 4 of the Prevention of Damages to Public Property Act, 1984 and Sections 3 and 4 of Explosive Substances Act, 1908.

Notice of motion was issued in both these petitions. Learned State counsel appeared and contested the same.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioners as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

From the record, I find that FIR has been registered on the statement of complainant-Madan Lal. As per the prosecution version, three unidentified persons on their Apache motor-cycle and 10-12 unknown persons came on their vehicles and they were having petrol bottles in a bag and some of them were also having baseball bats and other deadly weapons. They put on fire two cars and also broke glasses etc. of the office of Income-Tax Department. They also tried to put the office of Income-Tax on fire.

As per learned State counsel, damage to the tune of ₹80,000/- to the office of Income-Tax Department and about ₹9 lakhs to the cars has been caused due to the aforesaid act of the accused.

Three PWs namely complainant-Madan Lal, Tirath and Gurpreet have already been examined before the trial Court and they have not supported the prosecution version. There is no injury caused to anybody much less dangerous to life. The petitioners have been in

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custody since long. They are not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as they are in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping them in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, both these criminal miscellaneous petitions are allowed and the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail subject to their furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount each to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
