Learned counsel for the petitioner states that the dispute between the spouses has been resolved amicably through mediation. Copy of the settlement agreement dated 30.04.2018 has been placed on record. It is further stated that a petition, bearing No. CRM-M-22974-2018 for quashing of FIR on the basis of this settlement has been filed, which is listed for 30.08.2018 and a petition for divorce by mutual consent under Section 13-B of the Hindu Marriage Act has been filed on 25.05.2018 where statements of petitioners have been recorded on first motion and now is listed for 30.11.2018 for recording of statement of petitioner on second motion and a substantial amount of Rs.6.5 lakhs has been paid by Sukhjinder Singh-husband to Sharanjit Kaur-wife.

Learned counsel appearing for complainant admits this facts praying for complainant has no objection if pre-arrest bail is granted to the petitioner-Surjit Kaur, who is mother-in-law of the complainant.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Balwinder Singh, states that petitioner has since joined the investigation and as the dispute has been resolved between the parties amicably, she is not required by the local police for further investigation.

It being so, the interim bail granted to the petitioner vide order dated 22.02.2018 is made absolute, subject to her fulfilling conditions under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

The petition stands allowed accordingly.
