The present petition has been filed under Section 438 Code of Criminal Procedure for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.106 dated 18.11.2017 registered for the offences punishable under Sections 307, 452 read with Section 34 of Indian Penal Code and Section 25 and 27 Arms Act, at Police Station Fatehgarh Churian, Police District Batala.

It is the case of the prosecution that the present petitioner fired shot from his revolver on the complainant with the intention to kill him. However, the bullet hit on the side of left leg knee. The complainant was badly injured.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has already filed a complaint (Annexure P-1) against the members of the complainant party. The petitioner has also suffered injuries in the same incident along with other persons of his party.

Learned counsel for the complainant submits that the petitioner is not entitled to bail. He has placed reliance on CRM-M-49285-2017 decided on 24.1.2018 and FIR No.70 dated 13.11.2011 registered under Sections 452, 336, 427, 506, 34 IPC and 25 and 27 of Arms Act at PS Fatehgarh Churian, Police District Batala against Jasmeet Singh and others.

I have heard the learned counsel for the parties and gone through the record.

Anticipatory bail is extraordinary remedy.

Serious allegations have been levelled against the petitioner. He had caused gun shot injury on the knee of the left leg of the complainant. The investigating agency wants to recover the weapon of offence.

To the mind of this Court, the petitioner is not entitled to the concession of anticipatory bail as such the present petition stands dismissed.
