Short reply by way of affidavit of Shri Vivek Sangwan, Deputy Superintendent, District Jail, Yamuna Nagar produced by the learned State counsel is taken on record and a copy thereof supplied to learned counsel for the petitioner.

The petitioner, who is undergoing imprisonment in District Jail, Yamuna Nagar has filed the present petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India for issuance of directions to the respondents to release him on parole for three months for

medical purposes as he is seriously ill and not able to speak properly. Besides, he requires constant medical attendance.

Pursuant to the order dated 12.12.2017 passed by a Co-ordinate Bench of this Court, the jail authorities took the petitioner to P.G.I.M.E.R., Chandigarh where muscle charting, NCV study and MRI L/S spine of the petitioner was done. Based on the said tests, a Board, comprising of three doctors has given opinion that the petitioner has been diagnosed as Disc Bulge L3-L4 and L5-S1 with mild nerve compression. He has recovered after giving treatment and physiotherapy and is likely to improve with conservative treatment which includes physiotherapy, SWD and medication as advised by the P.G.I.M.E.R., Chandigarh.

In view of the above, no case is made out for issuing any directions to the jail authorities to release the petitioner on parole.

The petition is dismissed.
