For the reasons mentioned in the application, which are duly supported by an affidavit of the Clerk of the counsel, delay of 78 days in filing the present revision stands condoned.

Application stands disposed of.

Crl.Misc. Nos.7898-99 of 2018 & Criminal Revision No.818 of 2018

Counsel for the petitioner prays for withdrawal of the present revision with liberty to the petitioner to surrender before the Appellate Court at Patiala on **16.03.2018**. He further states that on surrender, he will move an application for grant of regular bail, which may be considered and decided at an early date.

In the light of the fact that co-accused of the petitioner, who

had preferred an appeal alongwith the petitioner, have been acquitted by the Appellate Court vide judgement dated 06.09.2017 and further the non-appearance of the petitioner was primarily because of the fact that he is a truck driver and had gone to South India and, thus, could not come present on the date fixed i.e. 18.01.2017, when he was declared as proclaimed offender, prayer made by counsel for the petitioner for withdrawal of the present revision petition is accepted.

The revision petition is dismissed as withdrawn.

In case the petitioner surrenders before the Appellate Court on 16.03.2018 and moves an application for grant of regular bail, the same shall be considered and decided at an early date preferably within a period of one week. The Court shall also take into consideration the fact that co-accused of the petitioner, who had preferred an appeal alongwith him, challenging the conviction and sentence awarded vide judgement/order dated 04.06.2015 by the Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Rajpura, have been acquitted of the charges levelled against them by giving them benefit of doubt vide judgement dated 06.09.2017.

Since the revision stands dismissed as withdrawn, no orders are required to be passed on the applications.
