1. Present petition was entertained with reference to letter dated 02.05.2018 of one Mr. Kuldip Singh son of Sh. Mohan Singh. In the letter dated 02.05.2018, Mr. Kuldip Singh has complained to the Commissioner, Punjab Police, Amritsar that his son Surinder Singh was taken away from his house by the official of CIA staff and whereabouts of Surinder Singh is not known. Further alleged that he apprehends that police officials could implicate Surinder Singh in some false case.

2. Notice of motion was ordered on 15.05.2018 asking the State counsel to accept notice and to get instructions. Pursuant to the direction read with order dated 16.05.2018, reply by way of affidavit dated 21.05.2018 of Sh. Sarabjit Singh Bajwa, PPS, Assistant Commissioner of Police, Investigation, Amritsar City on behalf of State of Punjab – respondent has presented. The same is taken on record. Perusal of the affidavit, it is evident that Surinder Singh was intercepted in public place

and he has not picked up from his house as stated by his father Kuldip Singh. FIR No. 75 dated 05.05.2018 has been registered for the offences under Sections 21, 22, 29 of N.D.P.S. Act, Police Station `C' Division, Amritsar City against Surinder Singh and three others.

3. In view of the fact that Surinder Singh is involved for the offences under the N.D.P.S. Act, therefore, this Court is satisfied that Surinder Singh has not picked up from his house as stated by his father Kuldip Singh.

4. In view of these facts and circumstances, instant petition stands disposed of.
