In the instant writ petition, petitioner has challenged only show cause notice dated 15.07.2015 (Annexure P8). Petitioner has remedy before the concerned authority by filing appropriate reply to show cause notice and appeal if any. Court can interfere in respect of show cause notice only on the score that if there is mala fide or any question of law is involved. Petitioner has not made a case so as to contend that show cause notice was issued with mala fide intention or it is contrary to any provision of law. Thus, petitioner has not made out a case. Accordingly, CWP stands dismissed. Reserving liberty to the petitioner to approach appropriate authority in terms of the remedy available to him.
