This common order shall dispose of both the aforesaid writ
petitions as common questions of law are involved therein.

Petitioner(s) in both the aforementioned writ petitions have laid

challenge to the Policy dated 23.05.2017 framed by respondent no.3-Punjab Police Academy, Phillaur, District Jalandhar whereby respondent department has refused to depute the petitioner(s) to Lower School Course under Rule 19.22 of the Punjab Police Rules, by giving reasons which are totally arbitrary and illegal being in violation of the Rule 19.22 of PPR and the letter dated 18.05.2013 issued by the respondents.

At the time of resumed hearing today, in compliance of the order dated 18.04.2018 passed by this Court, State Government has filed affidavit dated 08.05.2018 of Mr. Ravcharan Singh, PPS, Commandant-cum-Deputy Director (Administration), Punjab Police Academy, Phillaur on behalf of respondent nos.1 to 3 wherein it is stated that in all there are 15 constables on deputation in the three centres covered under Rule 19.22 of the Punjab Police Rules who are on deputation and mechanism for deputing them to Lower School Course has been finalized and stated in the affidavit filed today.

Learned Counsel for the parties are agreed that both the writ petitions have become infructuous in view of the stand in the affidavit dated 08.05.2018.

Dismissed as infructuous.

The Police Department shall be bound by their aforesaid stand.
