In the instant petition, petitioner has challenged the interim order dated 06.04.2018 (Annexure P-5) in respect of depositing 50% of the assessed amount with reference to Section 14-B of the EPF Act to entertain appeal. It is the discretionary power exercised by the Central Government Industrial Tribunal. Therefore, no interference is called for. Central Government Industrial Tribunal is requested to dispose of the petitioner's appeal within a reasonable period of six months from the date of receipt of deposit of 50% by the petitioner in terms of the order dated 06.04.2018. It is also made clear that if the petitioner succeeded in the appeal, in that event, petitioner is entitled to interest @ 6% per annum on the deposited amount.

2. With the above observation, petition stands disposed of.
