JASPAL SINGH, J (ORAL)

By virtue of instant petition preferred under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, petitioner has sought a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to release him the amount of leave encashment, security amount as well as arrears of leave encashment with revised pay scale w.e.f. 2004 and all consequential benefits along-with interest on the delayed payments thereof.

2. The contention of learned counsel for the petitioner is that petitioner moved representations including latest representation dated 14.08.2017 (P-6) with regard to the release of his retiral dues along-with leave encashment as well as arrears of pay fixation since 2004 and also amount of personal security but till date neither any reply has been received from the authorities nor any conscious decision has been taken thereon, by the authorities. He further

submits that he feels satisfied in case a direction is issued to respondents to consider and decide the representation dated 14.08.2017 (P-6) within some stipulated period.

3. Without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case as well as in view of submission made by learned counsel for the petitioner, instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondents to look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioner in his representation dated 14.08.2017 (P-6) and to take a conscious decision by passing a speaking order considering all the facts narrated in the aforesaid representation within a period of two months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order. In case, competent authority comes to the conclusion that petitioner is entitled to the relief(s) claimed, same be released to him within a period of next one month.

4. However, if petitioner still feels aggrieved by any of the orders passed by the aforesaid authority, he shall be at liberty to have recourse to other remedies available to him under law including to approach this Court.
