Widow-Ram Piari (petitioner No. 1) and the son-Gurpreet Singh (petitioner No. 2) of the deceased-Sohan Singh (T-Mate) have filed the present petition claiming the release of pensionary benefits, as also compassionate appointment, which has been denied vide the impugned order dated 24.09.2013 (**Annexure P-3**) on the ground that late-Sohan Singh was working as T-Mate on Work Charge Basis since 03.09.1980 and his services were never regularized prior to his death on 17.10.2009.

Upon notice, a reply dated 02.12.2016 has been filed.

It is pointed out that a speaking order dated 28.11.2016 (**Annexure R-1**) stands passed, whereby the services of Sohan Singh have been regularized w.e.f. 14.10.2009. Petitioner No. 1 (Ram Piari) has been granted the benefit of family pension and the son-petitioner No. 2 (Gurpreet Singh) has since been appointed on compassionate basis.

Counsel for the petitioners submits that only the arrears of family pension and the amount of gratuity remains to be paid.

Learned State Counsel submits/assures that the aforesaid relief shall be redressed within four month from today.

In view of the stand/assurance of the State Counsel, nothing more survives for adjudication in the present petition, as the same has become infructuous.

Dismissed as infructuous.

Respondents-State shall be bound by their stand, as taken.
