By virtue of instant petition preferred under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, petitioners have sought a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to grant them the pension and other retiral benefits including medical allowance by counting their past service rendered by them with Haryana State Minor Irrigation Tube-wells Corporation Ltd. (HSMITC) along-with arrears of pension with interest @18% per annum from the date of its accrual till its actual realization in terms of judgments dated 14.01.2017 (P-7 and P-8) passed in CWP No. 3792 of 2012 and CWP No. 10017 of 2014.

2.             The contention of learned counsel for the petitioners is that even, though respondents were duly served through the legal notice dated 30.12.2016 (P-12) but despite the fact that a period of more than 16 months has expired, neither any reply to the notice has been received nor any action has been taken

by the authorities till date. Learned counsel for the petitioners further submits that petitioners feels satisfied in case a direction is issued to respondents to consider and decide the afore-said legal notice within a time bound manner.

3. Without expressing any opinion on merit but considering the afore-said aspects, instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondents to look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioners in the legal notice dated 30.12.2016 (P-12) and to take a conscious decision in accordance with law, rules and regulations, within a period of four months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

4. However, if petitioners still feels aggrieved by any of the orders passed by the aforesaid authority, they shall be at liberty to have recourse to other remedies available under law including to approach this Court.
