By virtue of instant petition preferred under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, petitioners have sought a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to pay them monetary benefits after giving notional promotion to the post of Junior Assistant w.e.f the year 2001 i.e. the date from which their juniors were promoted OR in the alternative directing the official respondents to revert back respondent No.4 to his previous post in view of speaking order dated 24.07.2017 (P-10) passed by respondent No.3.

2. At the very outset, learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that petitioners feel satisfied in case a direction is issued to respondent No.3 to consider and decide the legal notice dated 30.08.2016 (P-7) in a time bound manner.

3. Without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case but considering the afore-said aspects, instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No. 3 to consider the case of the petitioners set out in the legal notice dated 30.08.2016 (P-7) and to decide the same in accordance with law, rules, regulations and instructions issued by the Government from time to time, within a period of three months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

4. However, if petitioners still feel aggrieved by any of the orders passed by the aforesaid authority, they shall be at liberty to have recourse to other remedies available under law including to approach this Court.
