Challenge in the present writ petition, filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, is to the order of the Financial Commissioner dated 20.04.2017 (Annexure P-3), since the order of the Commissioner dated 06.01.2017 (Annexure P-2) was upheld, whereby the matter had been remanded to the Collector, for fresh hearing.

Counsels point out that private-respondent No.4-Reshan Singh has expired and the copy of the death certificate, showing his date of death as 13.04.2018, has now been placed on record as Mark-A.

Keeping in view the above fact, counsel for the petitioner does not press the present writ petition and submits that the same may be disposed of, as having been rendered infructuous.
