Main Case

The present petition has been filed under Article 226 and 227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of certiorari, mandamus or any other suitable writ for quashing the impugned judgment dated 06.03.2017 (Anneuxre P6), passed by Central Administrative Tribunal, Chandigarh Bench, Chandigarh.

After arguing at length and finding that the Court was not inclined to interfere with the impugned order, learned counsel for the petitioners states that the claim of the respondent-workman would be accommodated as was done in the case of other similarly situated persons.

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The selection process initiated by the petitioners pursuant to the advertisement to regularize the services of all those incumbents who had been in service as casual labourers since 1988 or upwards was essentially concessional process intended to benefit all who had served the petitioners for various periods. Therefore, the argument that the respondent did not participate would be a failing one. Since the counsel for the petitioners has made a statement to accommodate the respondent in service on similar terms as was done to the other employees who faced the selection process, we deem it appropriate to dispose of the petition as not pressed. The necessary relief of regularization and attending consequential benefits be released to the respondent-workman within a period of four weeks from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.
