Through the instant civil writ petition, preferred under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, petitioner has sought the issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to grant him similar pay scale which was granted to the juniors and re-fix the pay scale and release the arrears with interest @ 18% per annum and also to re-fix his pension after granting him the higher pay scale as per junior and to release the arrears with interest @18% per annum; to count the daily wage service rendered by him w.e.f 14.02.1985 to 31.03.1993 on the post of T-mate and re-fix his pay scale and release the arrears along-with interest @ 18% per annum and also to decide the legal notice dated 15.11.2017 (P-3).

2. At the very outset learned counsel for the petitioner submits that he feels satisfied in case a direction is issued to respondents to consider and decide the legal notice dated 15.11.2017 (P-3) served upon the respondents, in a time bound manner.

3. Instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondents to look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioners in the legal notice dated 15.11.2017 (P-3) and to take a conscious decision by passing a speaking order considering all the facts narrated in the aforesaid legal notice within a period of four months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

4. However, if petitioner still feels aggrieved by any of the orders passed by the aforesaid authority, he shall be at liberty to have recourse to other remedies available under law including to approach this Court.
