G.S. SANDHAWALIA, J. (Oral) :

On 24.8.2017, following order was passed by a Coordinate Bench of this Court :-

“The Government of Punjab, Revenue, Rehabilitation & Disaster Management Department issued notification dated 19.10.2016 calling upon the applications from the war widows of 1971 Indo-Pak War for allotment of upto 10 acres of agricultural land. In Clause 10 (ii) of the said notification, it is provided that “the cash grant shall be Rs.50 lakhs only and shall be paid in three installments, first installment being Rs.20 lakhs only and thereafter, two, six monthly installments of Rs.15 lakhs each.”

Since there are four legal heirs of the petitioner-war widow (since deceased), therefore, learned counsel for the petitioner has prayed that he may be allowed to file affidavit to the effect that as to how the payment has to be made.

Adjourned to 5.9.2017.

Thereafter, on 18.9.2017, it was noted by a Coordinate Bench

that installment of Rs.20 lakhs has been received by the petitioner and thereafter, matter was adjourned since next installment would be paid after six months.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from Mr. Raman Guru, Senior Assistant, has informed that the balance two installments of Rs.30 lakhs were credited in the account of Kewal Singh, who is the elder son of the petitioner-war widow. He has placed on record photocopies of the transaction made by way of electronic mode on 19.3.2018 and the entry in favour of Kewal Singh dated 18.9.2018, which shows transfer of the amount in his bank account.

Counsel for the petitioners admits that the amount has been received by the petitioners, thus, the present petition has been rendered infructuous.

Disposed of as such.
