The petitioner applied for allotment of a residential plot in Sector 56-A, Faridabad in the reserved category of 'Wards of Freedom Fighters' as she is stated to be the grand-daughter of a freedom fighter. 2% plots were reserved for the above-stated category by HUDA. The petitioner was informed on 22.07.2015 that she was successful in draw of lots for allotment of plot No.47 in Sector 56-A, Faridabad. She was asked to submit the requisite documents which the petitioner is said to have submitted on 04.08.2015. As no allotment letter was issued, the petitioner represented the HUDA authorities on 28.12.2015. Vide letter dated 31.03.2016, the Estate Officer, HUDA forwarded the petitioner's representation to the Chief Administrator, HUDA, Panchkula for necessary action. However, the petitioner was informed on 31.10.2016 that the matter was still pending consideration before the higher authorities. The petitioner thereafter served the HUDA authorities as well as the State Government vide a legal notice dated 06.04.2018 (P-16) but finding no response thereto, she has filed the

of her claim as the grand-daughter of freedom fighter. From the official communication on record, it further appears that the matter re: allotment of plot to the petitioner is still pending consideration before the higher authorities.

Having heard learned counsel for the petitioner and keeping in view the above facts but without commenting on merits of the case, the instant writ petition is disposed of with a direction to the Chief Administrator, HUDA, Panchkula to consider and decide the above-mentioned claim of the petitioner by way of a reasoned order within a period of three months from the date of receiving a certified copy of this order. If the petitioner is found entitled to, let allotment letter be issued to her within one month thereafter.
