Through the instant civil writ petition, preferred under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, petitioner has sought issuance of a writ in the nature of Mandamus directing the respondents to count the military service rendering during the Second National Emergency from 03.12.1971 to 25.03.1977 towards pensionary benefits as per order dated 13.11.2014 (P-1) passed in CWP No.17661 of 2013 captioned as ***Rajinder Singh vs. State of Punjab & ors.*** by this Court and after count the same, revised pensionary benefits and pay the consequential benefits to him along with interest @ 18% p.a.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that though a legal notice was made to the respondents 07.05.2018 (P-3) but till date neither any reply to the said notice has been received nor any final order has been passed by the concerned Department. He further submits that he feels

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satisfied in case a direction is issued to respondents to decide the aforesaid legal notice (P-3), within some specified period.

3. Without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondents to look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioner in the legal notice dated 07.05.2018 (P-3) and to take a conscious decision by passing a speaking order in the light of the judgment (P-1) referred to above in this order, within a period of three months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

4. However, if petitioner still feels aggrieved by any of the orders passed by the aforesaid authority, he shall be at liberty to have recourse to the remedies available under law as well as to approach this Court.
