This writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India has been filed for the issuance of a writ, in the nature of certiorari for quashing/rectifying the misleading conditions of TET Test-I held on 10.08.2014 and direct the respondents to segregate the various categories for appearing in TET test.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that at this stage he would be satisfied, if a direction is issued to respondent No.3-Director, Education Recruitment Directorate Punjab Government Sr. Secondary School (Microsoft Building) Phase-3b1, Mohali to consider and decide the legal notice dated 18.01.2018 (Annexure P-9).

Heard.

In view of the above, without adverting to the merits of the case, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.3-Director, Education Recruitment Directorate Punjab Government Sr.

Secondary School (Microsoft Building) Phase-3b1, Mohali to consider and decide the legal notice dated 18.01.2018 (Annexure P-9) within six weeks from the receipt of the certified copy of the order. In case, on consideration, the competent authority reaches to the conclusion that the benefit claimed by the petitioner is admissible to her, in such eventuality, the consequential relief be allowed to her, within a period of six weeks thereafter. However, in case the competent authority feels that the relief claimed by the petitioner is not admissible or made out, in that case, a speaking order be passed in the matter.
