This writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India has been filed for the issuance of a writ, in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to pay the retiral benefits i.e. gratuity and commutation of pension along with interest @ 12% per annum till the realization of the retiral benefits.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that at this stage he would be satisfied, if a direction is issued to respondent No.1-Secretary, Punjab Mandi Board, Sector- 65-A, SAS Nagar, Mohali to consider and decide the legal notice dated 02.05.2018 (Annexure P-2).

Heard.

In view of the above, without adverting to the merits of the case, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.1-Secretary, Punjab Mandi Board, Sector- 65-A, SAS Nagar, Mohali to consider and decide the legal notice dated 02.05.2018 (Annexure P-2) within

six weeks from the receipt of the certified copy of the order. In case, on consideration, the competent authority reaches to the conclusion that the benefit claimed by the petitioner is admissible to him, in such eventuality, the consequential relief be allowed to him, within a period of six weeks thereafter. However, in case the competent authority feels that the relief claimed by the petitioner is not admissible or made out, in that case, a speaking order be passed in the matter.
