By virtue of instant petition preferred under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, petitioners have sought the issuance of a writ especially in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to revise their pay and pension by granting them the extra wages on account of working on Saturdays and holidays in lieu of the various judgments passed by the High Court as well as judgment passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the case of *Municipal Employees Union and others Vs. State of Punjab and others; 2000 (9) SCC 432* along with interest under the provisions of rule and law passed by the Government and judgment passed the Hon'ble Supreme Court and High Court.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that though a legal notice dated 30.05.2018 (P-4) was served upon the respondents but till date neither any reply to the afore-said notice has been received nor any conscious

decision has been taken by the authorities. He further submits that he feels satisfied in case a direction is issued to respondents to consider and decide the afore-said legal notice dated 30.05.2018 (P-4) within a time bound manner.

3. Without expressing any opinion on merit as well as in view of submission made by learned counsel for the petitioners, instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondents to look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioners in their legal notice dated 30.05.2018 (P-4) and to decide the same in accordance with law as well as service rules particularly in view of observations made by Hon'ble Apex Court in case **Municipal Employees Union and others Vs. State of Punjab and others 2000 (9) SCC 432**, within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order. In case the petitioners still feel aggrieved by any inaction of the respondents, they shall be at liberty to have recourse to other remedies available under the law including to approach this Court.
