By virtue of instant petition preferred under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, petitioner has sought a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to grant the due gratuity, GPF, leave encashment and other pensionary benefits with interest upto date, for the service rendered by him in the Respondent department, which has not been cleared by the respondents till today.

2. The contention of learned counsel for the petitioner is that petitioner stood retired on June 30, 2015 as Pump Operator. Yet no retiral benefits has been disbursed to him despite the fact that a period of 5 months has expired. Even, he moved an application/representation dated October 23, 2017 (P-1) Learned counsel for the petitioner further submits that that he feels satisfied in case a direction is issued to respondent No.2 to dispose of the application/representation dated October 23, 2017 (P-1) within a time bound manner.

3. Keeping in view of the afore-said facts, instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.2 to look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioner in the representation/application (P-1) and to decide the same in accordance with law, rules, regulations and instructions issued by the Government from time to time, within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order. In case the petitioner still feels aggrieved by any order of the afore-said authority, he shall be at liberty to approach this Court.
