JASPAL SINGH, J. (Oral)

By virtue of instant petition preferred under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, the petitioner has sought issuance of writ in the nature of certiorari/mandamus directing the respondents to release gratuity, leave encashment and regular pension and commutation of pension or in the alternative quash the charge sheet.

2. At the very outset of the arguments, it has emerged that benefit accrued to the petitioner on account of his retirement has since been released and now, the dispute pertains only to the grant of interest on the alleged delayed payments.

3. However, at this juncture, learned counsel for the petitioner intends

to withdraw the instant petition with liberty to take recourse to the remedies available under law including to file a representation to the department concerned for the redressal of his grievances with regard to grant of interest on the delayed payment and/or to approach this Court by filing a writ petition.

4. Dismissed as withdrawn, with liberty as prayed for.
