By virtue of the instant civil writ petition, preferred under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, petitioners have sought the issuance of a writ in the nature of Certiorari for quashing the order dated July 31, 2017 (P-11) to the extent of not granting interest on the arrears of revised pension payable to the petitioners as per Government instruction and further to release the arrears of pension now being granted to the petitioners in the corresponding scale of Rs.37400-67000 + AGP Rs.9000/- w.e.f. January 01, 2006 like lecturers of Government colleges, Haryana along with interest as per Government instructions.

2. At the very outset, learned counsel for the petitioners submits that he feels satisfied in case a direction is issued to respondents to decide the Legal Notice dated August 21, 2017 (P-12) in a time bound manner.

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3. Without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondents to look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioners in the Legal Notice dated August 21, 2017 (P-12) and take a conscious decision by passing a speaking order considering all the facts narrated in the aforesaid Legal Notice, within a period of four months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

4. However, if petitioners still feel aggrieved against any of the order(s) passed by the aforesaid authority, they shall be at liberty to approach this Court.
