Through the instant civil writ petition, preferred under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, petitioner has sought the issuance of a writ in the nature of Mandamus directing the respondents to release the grant of financial benefits of pay revision along with arrears accruing upon the revision of pay scales by the order dated 26.12.2013 (P-1) after the implementation of 5th Pay Commission of the Government of Punjab from 01.01.2006 to 31.12.2013 (P-1) but not paid till date as also the benefit of pay and allowances for the period of suspension and no pay between 05.03.2014 to 25.07.2014 after adjusting the subsistence allowance as well as release the terminal contributory retirement and provisional pensionary benefits of him upon his retirement w.e.f. 30.04.2017 vide order passed on 28.04.2017 (P-5) followed by extension in service along with interest @ 18% p.a.

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2. Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that though various representations dated 16.02.2018, 16.04.2018 & 12.06.2018 (P-8 to P-10 respectively) were made to the respondents but till date neither any reply to the said representations has been received nor any final order has been passed by the concerned Department. He further submits that he feels satisfied in case a direction is issued to respondent No.2 to decide the above said representations (P-8 to P-10), within some specified period.

3. Without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.2-The Deputy Commissioner, Rupnagar, Mini Secretariat, Near Bus Stand, Rupnagar, District Rupnagar, Punjab to look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioner in the representations dated 16.02.2018, 16.04.2018 & 12.06.2018 (P-8 to P-10) and to take a conscious decision by passing a speaking order as per rules and instructions issued by the Government of Punjab from time to time, within a period of three months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

4. However, if petitioner still feels aggrieved by any of the orders passed by the aforesaid authority, he shall be at liberty to have recourse to the remedies available under law as well as to approach this Court.
