This petition is filed by four petitioners. It is averred in the petition that petitioner No.1 has passed his B.Ed. from the University of Kashmir and petitioners No.2 to 4 have passed their B.Ed. from Indira Gandhi National Open University, Delhi. They are serving the Education Department of Haryana as JBT teachers and for their further promotion to the post of TGT, they are required to pass specific teaching subject in B.Ed.. They all are keen to got promotion in Punjabi subject and for that they got the admission in B.Ed additional subject but they were not permitted to take examination of B.Ed. additional subject held on 6.7.2018, vide letter dated 28.5.2018, on the ground that they have not passed their B.Ed. from any University of the State of Haryana.

Learned counsel for the petitioner, in support of his submissions, has relied upon an order passed by this Court in ***CWP No.15821 of 2018*** titled as ***“Mahaveer Singh and others Vs. Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra and another”*** decided on 6.7.2018. In that case the

granted to the said students in equity to take their examinations but while parting with the said order it was made clear that in case the University feels that the B.Ed. additional subject students should not appear in B.Ed. additional subjects, if they had not passed their B.Ed. from Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra or any other University of the State of Haryana then it should ensure that the B.Ed. colleges affiliated to the University do not give admission to such kind of students so that they may not rush to the Court at the eleventh hour for redressal of their grievance much less to take the examinations. It was also made clear that in case any college affiliated to the State of Haryana would give admission to such students, who are not eligible to take B.Ed. additional subject examination in view of Clause 16 of the Ordinance, the University shall take strict action against the said college including their disaffiliation.

Thus the prayer made by the petitioners, in this case, for allowing them to appear in the B.Ed. additional examination cannot be allowed because there is a complete bar in Clause 16 of the Ordinance. Hence, the present writ petition is hereby dismissed.
