By virtue of instant petition preferred under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, petitioner has sought the issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to grant him all the service and retiral benefits along-with all arrears with interest @ 18% per annum.

2. The contention of learned counsel for the petitioner is that except correspondence with the inter-se department no final decision has been taken by the authorities concerned upon the legal notice dated 12.03.2018 (P-6) followed by another legal notice dated 07.05.2018 (P-8). He further submits that he feels satisfied in case a direction is issued to respondents to decide the afore-said legal notices dated 12.03.2018 (P-6) and 07.05.2018 (P-8) in a time bound manner.

3. Without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.2 to take a final decision on the legal notices dated 12.03.2018 (P-6) and 07.05.2018 (P-8) in accordance with law, rules and regulations that too, by passing a speaking order within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

4. However, in case petitioner feels aggrieved by any order(s) of the afore-said authority, he shall be at liberty to have recourse to other remedies available under the law including to approach this Court.
