Through the instant civil writ petition, preferred under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, petitioner has sought issuance of a writ in the nature of Mandamus directing the respondents to finalize his pensionary benefits i.e. pension, gratuity, commutation of pension, leave encashment, GPF and GIS etc as per circulars dated 01.02.2018 and 19.02.2018 respectively (P-11 and P-12) with further prayer for decide the representation and to release all the retiral benefits with interest @18% per annum.

2. File perused.

3. A perusal of the file transpires that petitioner has already served representation dated 30.07.2018 (P-10) upon respondent No.3 but neither the respondent has responded to the aforesaid representation (P-10) nor taken any conscious decision. So in the aforesaid facts and circumstances, this Court is of

the considered view that instant petition can be conveniently disposed of by giving a direction to respondent No.3 to take a conscious decision within some stipulated period.

4. Accordingly, without expressing anything on merits but considering the inaction on the part of the respondents, instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondents to consider the grievances unfolded by the petitioner in the representation dated 30.07.2018 (P-10) and to take a conscious decision by passing a speaking order, within a period of three months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

5. However, if petitioner still feels aggrieved against any order passed by the aforesaid authority, he shall be at liberty to have recourse to the remedies available under law as well as to approach this Court.
