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**JASPAL SINGH, J. (ORAL)**

Through the instant civil writ petition, preferred under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, petitioner has sought the issuance of a writ in the nature of Mandamus directing the respondents to grant interest @ 18% on the delayed payments of various retiral dues accrued to him on account of his retirement.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that though a legal notice dated 16.07.2018 (P-4) was duly served upon the respondents but till date neither any reply to the said legal notice has been received nor any final order has been passed by the respondents. He further submits that he feels satisfied in case a direction is issued to respondent No.2 to decide the afore-said legal notice (P-4) in a time bound manner.

3. Instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondents

particularly to respondents No.1 and 2 to look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioner in the legal notice dated 16.07.2018 (P-4) and to take a conscious decision by passing a speaking order considering all the facts narrated in the aforesaid legal notice as well as in view of judgment passed by Full Bench of this Court in case *A.S. Randhawa vs. State of Punjab & Ors., 1997 (3) SCT 468* and also judgment passed by this Court in CWP No.8772 of 2015 captioned as *Charan Dass vs. State of Punjab & Ors.* decided on July 11, 2017 and also in view of instructions bearing No. 1/15/90-IFPIII/4226, dated May 10, 1990, within a period of three months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order. In case the competent authority comes to the conclusion that petitioner is entitled to the relief(s), same be released to him within next one month.

4. However, if petitioner still feels aggrieved by any of the orders passed by the aforesaid authority, he shall be at liberty to have recourse to other remedies available under the law including to approach this Court.
