Through the instant civil writ petition, preferred under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, petitioner has sought the issuance of a writ in the nature of Mandamus directing the respondents to treat her resignation as deemed voluntary retirement w.e.f. 30.04.2017 because she had completed qualifying service of more than 20 years on regular basis and also to release her all due retirement benefits for the service actually rendered by her together.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that though a representation was made to the respondent No.2 on 22.05.2017 (P-5) but till date neither any reply to the said representation has been received nor any final order has been passed by respondent No.2.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner further submits that petitioner feels satisfied in case a direction is issued to respondent No.2 to decide her representation dated 22.05.2017 (P-5) in a time bound manner.

4. Instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.2 to look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioner in her representation dated 22.05.2017 (P-5) and to take a conscious decision in accordance with law, rules, regulation and after considering all the facts narrated in the aforesaid representation within a period of three months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

5. However, if petitioner still feels aggrieved by any of the orders passed by the aforesaid authority, she shall be at liberty to have recourse to other remedies available under the law including to approach this Court.
